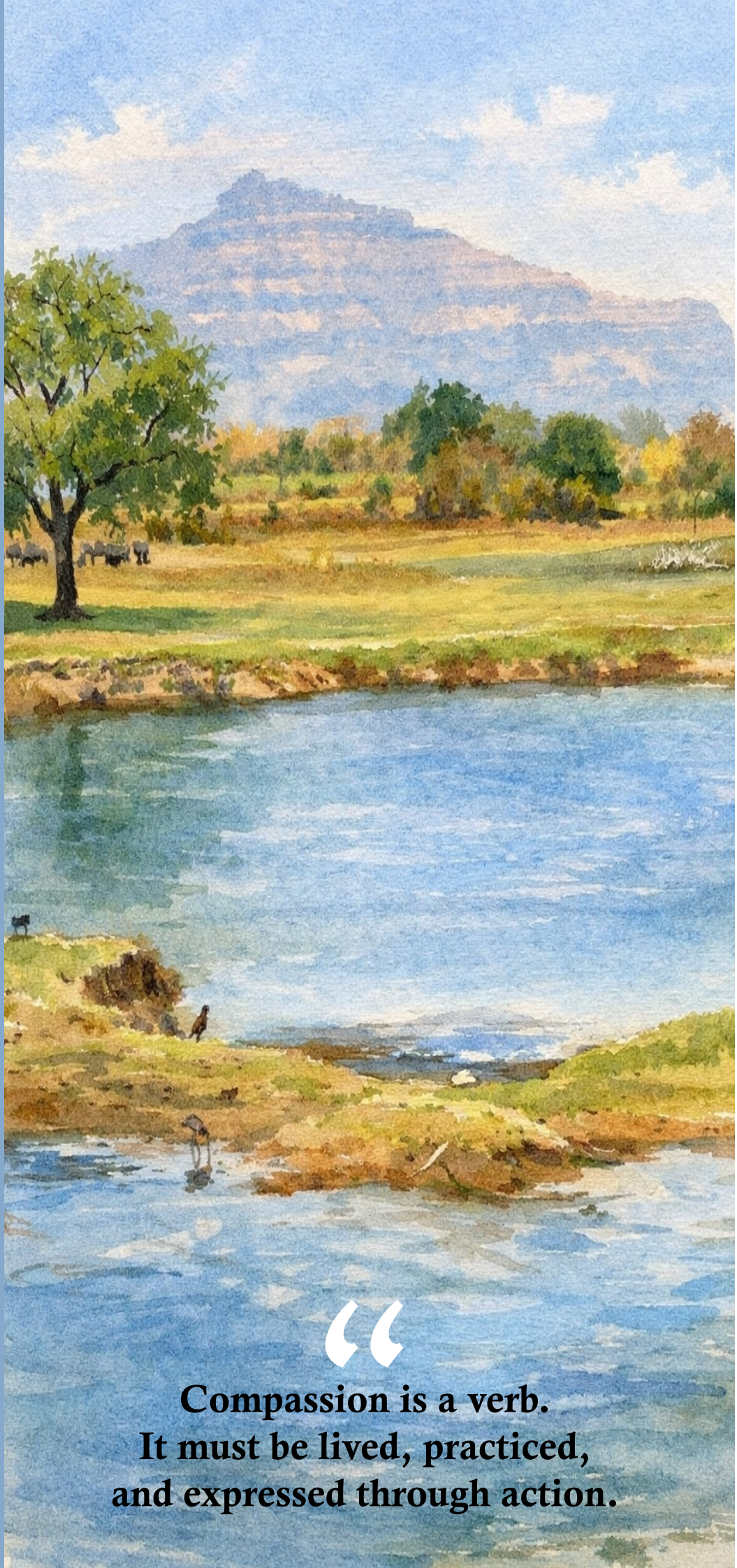

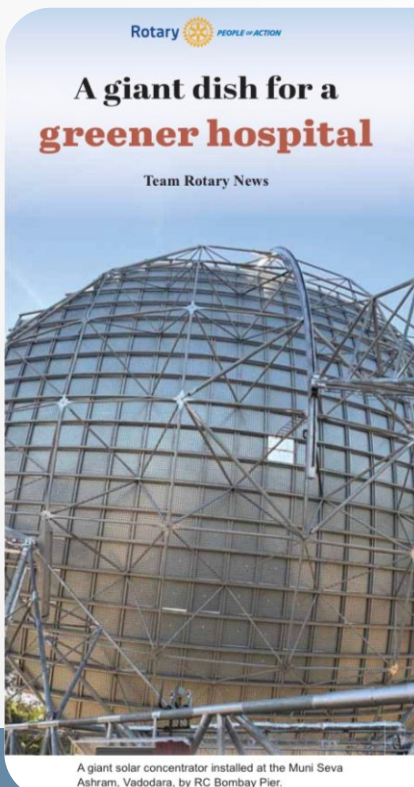
In healthcare, learning is not an option; it is a responsibility:

Rotary PEOPLE OF ACTION A giant dish for a greener hospital Team Rotary News

In a landmark initiative to promote sustainable healthcare, the Rotary Club of Bombay Pier, RID 3141, has supported the installation of a mega-sized solar concentrator at Muni Seva Ashram, which houses the Kailash Cancer Hospital in Goraj village near Vadodara, Gujarat.

This project was made possible in December 2025 through a CSR India Grant of ₹1.6 crore from Apar Industries. Club secretary Murtuza Sitarwala says this installation represents one of the most advanced applications of renewable energy in the healthcare sector in India.

The device consists of a massive solar dish capable of powering a 600-tonne air-conditioning unit at the hospital. Rising to the height of a seven-storey building and spanning 25 metres in diameter, the parabolic solar

concentrator is embedded with hundreds of precision mirrors. These mirrors focus sunlight onto a single focal point, generating extremely high temperatures of around 1,070°C using only solar energy.

Water passing through a receiver at this focal point is converted into high-pressure steam. This steam is then used to operate a vapour absorption refrigeration system, enabling large-scale solar-powered air conditioning. The solar dish is also equipped with smart software that continuously tracks the sun's movement, ensuring

maximum efficiency throughout the day.

Originally developed in Australia by the Australia National University and Sunrise CSP, an Australia-based company, the concentrator was now built in India following an initiative by Ashram board member Deepak Gadhiya.

When representatives from Australia visited Dholera, a green-field industrial smart city 100km from Ahmedabad, for a proposed desalination plant, they expressed interest to bring the solar concentrator technology to India. A subsidiary was subsequently

established in India and the first solar dish was installed at the Ashram three years ago, explains Sitarwala. The steam generated from this earlier installation continues to be used for cooking, laundry and other daily operations.

The two environment-friendly facilities will significantly reduce dependence on conventional power sources and help lower carbon emissions, he says.

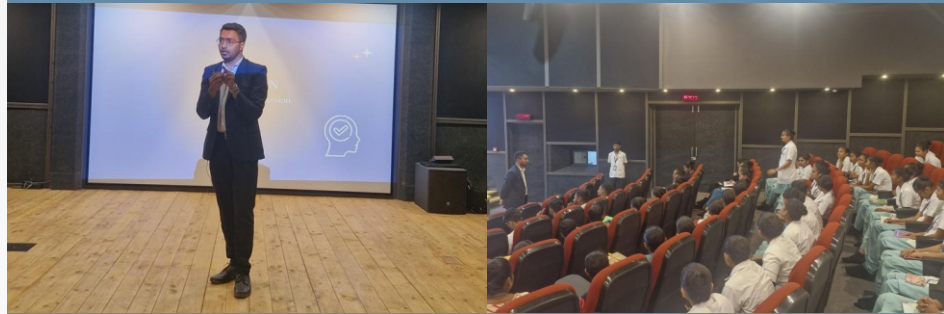
The hospital authorities have promised that the significant cost saved in electricity from the use of the green devices will be passed on to introduce better patient care facilities at the hospital. ■

A few days ago, he visited us to explore our BigDish initiative and stayed at the Ashram for nearly two days. During this time, he immersed himself in our work, engaged with our team, and experienced the spirit of service firsthand. We are happy to present his reflections and insights from the visit.

A Thousand Acres of Purpose: Inside the Green Vision of Muni Seva Ashram, Vadodara, Gujarat

I Went to Learn About a Solar Dish. I Left With So Much More.

My visit to Muni Seva Ashram began with one clear purpose, and ended with lessons that will stay with me for a very long time.

A Small Jhopdi That Became a 1000-Acre Movement

Founded in 1978 by Anuben Thakkar, inspired by her guru Muni Maharaj, the Ashram was born out of a singular calling to serve, educate, and uplift local tribal communities. What started as a small *Jhopdi* has grown into a 1000-acre campus radiating simplicity, selflessness, perseverance, and quiet determination.

It is not just an institution. It is a philosophy made physical.

The Big Dish and What It Represents

The “Big Dish” solar concentrator, the world's largest; is the Ashram's most visible symbol of innovation. It spans 26 metres in diameter, stands as tall as a seven-storey building, and powers the heating, cooling, cooking, and sterilization across the campus. Capable of cooking meals for over 2,000



people daily and running a 100-ton air-conditioning plant entirely on steam from solar energy, the technology is a landmark in India's clean energy story.

But here's the thing, the Big Dish is just the headline. The real story is everything surrounding it.

Dr. Kalam's Words Still Echo Here

During my conversation with Deepak Gadhia, sir, Trustee of the Ashram and the man behind the Big Dish's India-first manufacturing initiative, one quote stood out above everything else. When Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam ji visited, he told the Ashram:

“You are not just building an Ashram here, but a model village system; self-sustainable, using the best technological practices, creating a model which will act as a base to scale across the 6.65 lakh villages of India, solving the basic problems and needs of society.”

That single statement reframed everything I saw that day.

The Big Picture and the Small Details

At the macro level, you see technologies operating at remarkable scale. But as you

begin walking the campus and observing its everyday functioning, you notice the small experiments, the simple processes, the quiet innovations; each one doing significant work in the Ashram's daily system.

What struck me even more was how deeply the students, faculty, and staff are woven into the functioning of these technologies. They don't just use these systems; they test, experiment, and learn through them every single day.

Built With Intention: Passive Architecture as Soul

"Building through Passive Architecture", this phrase echoed throughout my visit, and it was visible everywhere I looked.

Every unit on campus is designed with the climate, the user, and sustainability at its core, not as a checkbox, but as the very reason for its existence. Courtyards inside buildings, insulated rooftops, double walls, all working together to significantly reduce the need for artificial lighting and cooling. Sustainability here is not a buzzword. It is the blueprint.

"Together We Fight, Together We Heal"

The Kailash Cancer Hospital inside the Ashram carries this motto with intention. It is not merely a medical facility, it is a space designed to give patients not just advanced care, but hope. The architecture, the warmth of its staff, the sense of belonging they cultivate, all of it speaks to a deeper understanding of healing.

The Part That Will Stay With Me the Longest

The defining part of the entire visit was how connected and at peace every member was in

that space, in that system of trust and mutual respect, may it be the tribal students making use of the numerous facilities around, or the elderlies getting the best out of their final years, or the mentally challenged women who gave a wholesome sense of how welcoming and supportive should we as humans be in our daily lives. Visiting the facilities of these mentally challenged women, The first thing their caretaker said when we walked in was simple and profound: "*We wanted them to feel like queens,*" with courtyard gardens, swings, and facilities which makes them feel like they are a special part of Mother Earth, giving warmth and comfort to each other. Once you try to look at the world through their lens, every other problem seems too small to really crib about.

What I Came For. What I Left With.

I came to understand the Big Dish. I left carrying sustainability, collaboration, innovation, willpower, determination, respect, and a renewed sense of why we do the work we do.

As a member of the MAEER's MIT Vishwaprayag family, it fills me with pride to know that we are closely associated with Muni Seva Ashram, sharing knowledge, culture, and a shared commitment to growing together for the betterment of our community.

Some places teach you through curriculum. Some teach you through experience. And some like this one, teach you simply by *being*.

Muni Seva Ashram is one of those rare places.

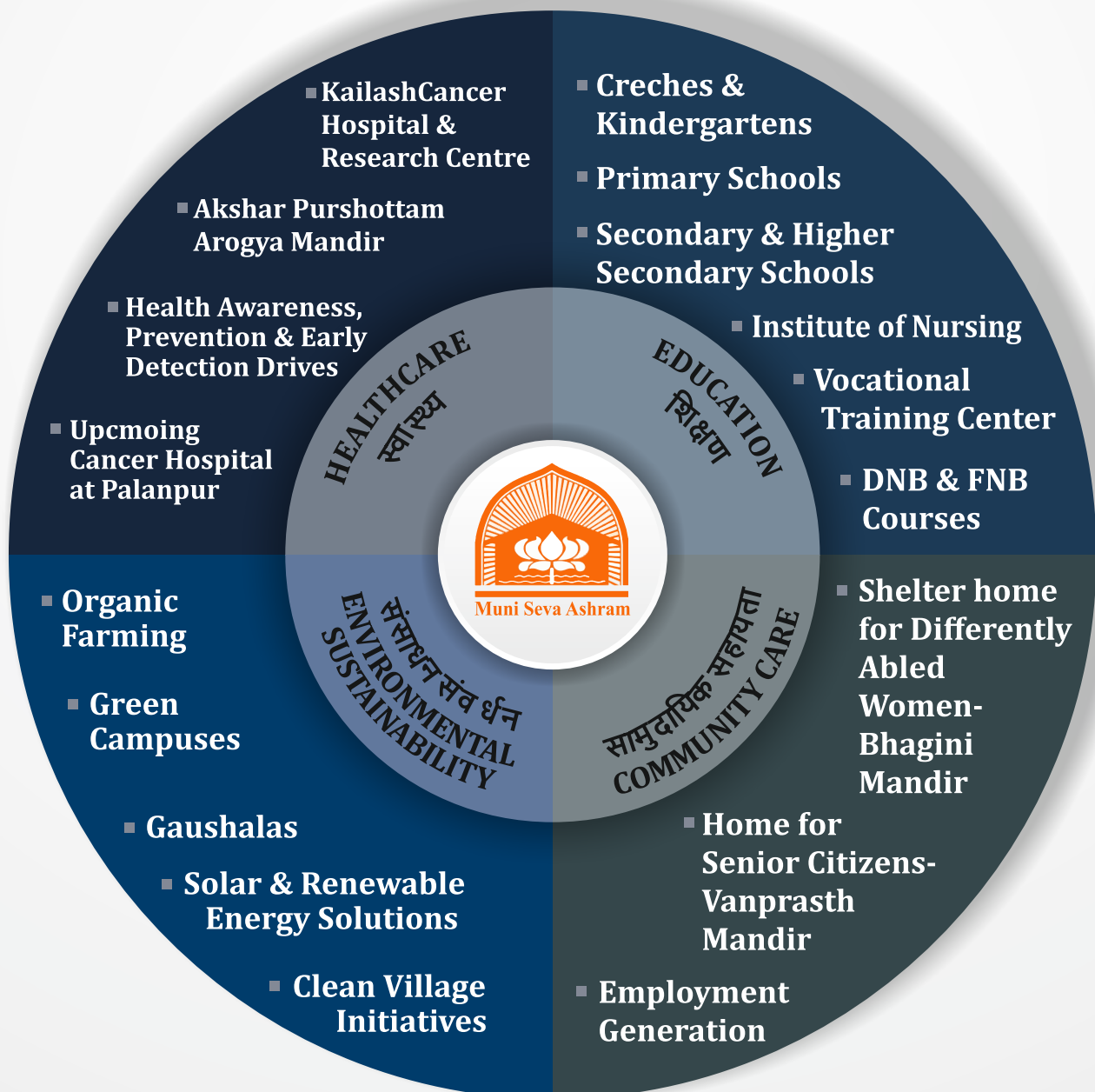
